



What is the CIS?

The Centres for Individual Studies (CIS) are an alternative secondary school in the Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board. Our unique and flexible programs may help you graduate faster than you think!

What is the CIS advantage?

We help you achieve success by designing your education to suit your schedule, learning style and goals. Our unique alternative programs include:



- Flexible timetabling, so that you can schedule your education around your employment, child care and other responsibilities.
- Individualized timetables and "continuous intake," which means you can start at any time during the school year and work at your own pace, with support from your teachers.
- Specialized cooperative education for students over 21 (Earn as You Learn Co-op), which allows you to earn credits while you're working.
- Paid cooperative education for students who are currently employed.
- Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR) for adult students; your previous work, learning and life experiences may earn you high school credits.
- Maturity credits for adults who originally started high school before September 1999, who may be granted credits for experience in the workforce.
- Dual credits taught by college and secondary instructors, which allow you to earn both a high school credit and a college credit in specific areas, such as skilled trades and culinary.
- Centre for Success Dual Credit Program, a full semester program in a classroom on the Durham College Campus; earn both high school and a college dual credit as a "jumpstart" into college.
- School for Young Moms, which allows pregnant teens and mothers under the age of 21 to continue their high school education, develop their parenting skills, and receive on-site childminding for their infants.
- Community partnerships, which allow us to offer programs that combine credit courses with community skills training programs.
- Access to technology, so that you can upgrade your computer skills.

Continuing Education Programs

The CIS also offers the following continuing education programs:

Literacy Basic Skills (LBS) offers non-credit, individual programs for people who need to develop their basic reading, writing and math skills. LBS helps students move into further education, retraining or employment.

Independent study allows students age 18 and older who are unable to attend school during the day, the chance to earn credits on their own time.

International language classes for elementary students provide beginner and intermediate level language instruction, free of charge. Programs are scheduled after school or on Saturday mornings.

International language credit courses provide secondary credit courses in several languages, for Grades 9-12, free of charge.
